Spartans (12-3) win Prep Bowl

The long roller-coaster ride for Marian Catholic's seniors came to an end with the Spartans at the top of the heap on Friday at Soldier Field.

Marian responded to a Chicago Simeon comeback effort with the clinching score with 5:04 to play, as the Spartans captured their first Prep Bowl title in school history with a 23-14 victory.

On the heels of an appearance in the Class 5A state title team a year ago, this squad became the second winningest at Marian with a final mark of 12-3.

Marian prevailed in fitting fashion.

Three-year senior quarterback Mike Gavin bulled in from the 1 for the clinching score after tossing earlier touchdown passes to Mike DiGiulio (14 yards) and Bris Dawkins (58 yards).

Meanwhile, the heart and soul of this Marian squad, Eric Papp, ignited a defense that was stingy when it needed to be. Papp reeled in a pair of Marian's four interceptions, including one in the final seconds that took the last gasp out of Simeon (10-5).

"We just started this thing over after the playoffs and the seniors said we just didn't want to stop playing," Papp explained. "We went to state last year, but I don't think it was nearly as much fun as this."

Marian bolted to a 16-0 lead courtesy of the two touchdown hurls by Most Valuable Player Gavin (eight of 14, 117 yards). However, Simeon pulled within 16-14 midway through the fourth quarter.

That's when the Spartans went on a nine-play, 70-yard drive to complete their four-game run through the Prep Bowl playoffs. Bottled up for much of the contest, senior tailback Deon Bradley (21 carries, 89 yards) came to life on the critical drive.

Carrying six times, Bradley finally busted loose for a 25-yard scamper to the Blue Machine 4-yard line. After Bradley carried again for 3 yards, Gavin followed Nick McDonnell and Josh Vittori into the end zone. Sergio Flores, who had earlier split the uprights with a 36-yard field goal, kicked the crucial conversion for the nine-point surplus.

"The key was tempo on that drive," Gavin explained. "They were sucking for air and we just kept pushing. We knew we had to run the ball and have a balanced attack.

"We saw this as an opportunity to finish off the year with a win and prove something to people. We didn't want to be known as the team that was 'supposed' to be good."

While the Marian defense yielded more than 250 yards, it raised its level for big plays on several occasions. John Sandrick and Sergio Flores joined Papp in the interception department.

Marian had seven quarterback sacks of Simeon signal-caller Kurtis Ellison, with Pat Thomas, Quentin Sykes, Cedrick Middleton, Nick Schneider, Duane Harrigan, Jonathan McMahon and Brian Mundee (fumble recovery) all getting in the act.

"Their quarterback gave us some trouble with his scrambling," Papp admitted. "But we were ready for everything they did."
